DISCIPLINE

A disciplinary hearing involving a Birchencliffe player has been held. Results of the hearing will be available after the appeal period has expired.

A disciplinary hearing for two charges, involving Denby Grange player, J Balmforth has been held. The judgement of the Disciplinary Panel was that, with regard to both charges he is suspended from playing for a period of 28 days from midnight on 6 August 2010 to midnight on 3 September 2010. It was also decided that 14 days of the punishment, i.e. 20 August to 3 September 2010 be suspended for a period of 12 months. J Balmforth advised the Disciplinary Panel that he would not be appealing against the decision.

Because of the many occasions, this season that result and team sheets have been submitted late, the Management Board are left with no alternative than to commence, with immediate effect, the additional deduction of 1 point for late submission. See Rule 8C quoted below:

Rule 8C

Failure to forward fully completed Result or Team Sheets by the required time will incur the following fines: - first offence £5, second £10, third and fourth offences £20, thereafter £25 per offence. After the fifth, the club will be asked to appear before the Management Board. If a missing Result or Team Sheet is not forwarded to the league within 7 days of receiving a reminder from a League official then the Management Board shall have the power to add an extra £5 fine for every further week that the Result/Team Sheet remains outstanding unless a satisfactory explanation is received; **in addition to this, a 1 point deduction may be made from that team's overall points total.**

UMPIRES APPOINTMENT SECRETARY

On 17 July 2010, all umpires except 1 attended at matches, however, on 7 August 2010 there were 12 umpires short.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- Denby Grange representatives, Ian Cooper, Chairman and Mark Ackroyd, 1XI Captain attended to explain reasons for Denby Grange's administration failures and to work out with the Management Board how to rectify the situation.
- Representatives from Edgerton & Dalton failed to attend to explain reasons for many failures to send in match results. To be requested to attend the next meeting.
- Ground Reports - most grounds have now been visited and some grounds visited are excellent or good to very good but there are some who are just falling short of the required standard. Quite a few grounds are having problems with bounce in their pitches. Further ground visits will be conducted and appropriate letters sent to clubs in due course.
- Ramadan will commence on Thursday 12 August to Thursday, 9 September 2010 – Clubs will have to pay for teas unless they inform their opponents by the Wednesday preceding the game that teas are not required.
- Rule Changes – clubs are reminded that any rule changes need to be sent to the League Secretary by 1 October 2010 and should be seconded by another club.
- Promotion/Relegation - there is a possibility that Cawthorne will be leaving HCCL, in which case both their teams will be classed as being relegated. Therefore, clubs are advised in advance that the standard 2 up and 2 down situation will more than likely not be possible.
- It is with sadness that we have to report the death of a cricket stalwart, Fred Marsh (85 years old) ex Thurgoland and Penistone groundsman and captain. On behalf of HCCL the Management Board, send sincere condolences to his wife and family.

- The Yorkshire Cricket Board honoured the volunteers in cricket at a ceremony held at the B & B Yorkshire Cricket Centre on Thursday 5 August 2010 celebrating outstanding achievements. Huge congratulations are given to the four winners from HCCL:

Leagues and Boards - Runner Up - IAN LIVESEY YCA - Halifax & Huddersfield ACC

Ian has spent 25 years with his club Flockton in various officer positions. He has been on the Halifax and Huddersfield Area Cricket Council for 16 years as Huddersfield Central league representative and has been Area Council Treasurer for 11 years and Secretary for 6 years. He has represented the Area Council on YCA for 13 years. He is also on the Huddersfield Central League executive. Latterly he has been the YCB Clubs and leagues secretary for 3 years and Disciplinary Officer for 2 years - all in all a huge commitment to cricket.

Services to Cricket Coaching - Winner - IAN HALES - Almondbury Wesleyans

- YCB Coaches Association, Huddersfield Coaches

He started as a junior at Almondbury Wesleyans and is still involved there 40 years on. He has been 1st and 2nd XI captain and now captains the 3rd XI. His last ten or more years have been involved in coaching at junior level. But his nomination is for his role in the YCN Pathways Centre at Heckmondwike for many years and for his roles in the Huddersfield Branch of the YCB CA. But more than this, he is Coaches course tutor, Assessor and Internal Verifier, Chairman of the YCB Coaches Association and of the YCB Coach Education Management Group overseeing the huge improvement in the training and qualification coaches (and their numbers) across Yorkshire. He is also the Yorkshire representative to Northern ECBACO Forum and the Northern Representative to the ECB National Forum. He is shaping the future of players and cricket by shaping the future of coaching itself and its development.

Young Coach of the Year - Runner Up - DAN BAMFORTH - Higham CC

Dan is just 19 but puts the majority of his spare time into coaching the junior section. The clubs have 2 sides at under 13 and 1 at under 17 and wherever there is a game or practice session Dan is there. He also gives up some of his time to coach children and the local primary school and, hopefully, he will be coaching at other schools in the local area soon. His biggest impact over the past 12 months has been with grant funding where he has secured grants for an artificial wicket and for a bowling machine, fielding machine, and various aids for junior coaching. Dan is extremely active on the fundraising side, obtaining a number of items for a successful auction and is also at the front of our push to achieve the Clubmark accreditation. Dan's latest project is to secure funding for a new pavilion and, although the cost of the project is high, I have no doubts that with his enthusiasm and drive, and with a little help, he will achieve his, and the clubs, dream in the not too distant future. Dan is now an ECB Level 2 coach and has also been on the development courses at the start of 2010 and his dedication to Higham Cricket Club and the junior section in particular is immense.

Disability Achiever of the Year - Winner - DARRELL SYKES - Almondbury Wesleyans, England Deaf

Darrell is an extremely talented profoundly deaf sportsman, playing Cricket and Football for the Deaf England sides. As far as his club is concerned, however Darrell has been a tremendous asset in the last twelve months. Last season (2009) he took 68 League wickets at 8.71 and scored 221 runs at an average of 36.83. These performances, along with other team members, were an integral part of the promotion to the Arrow Huddersfield Central League Premier Section. Darrel has also helped a colleague from the first team to teach club members sign language to enable us to communicate better with him. The one thing, which we all notice, is his ability, not his disability which makes him a great role model for our junior players
